

# John McCain Opposes Family Planning



- John McCain has voted to terminate the Title X family-planning program, which provides millions of women with health-care services ranging from birth control to breast cancer screenings.<sup>1</sup>
- John McCain has voted against funding teen-pregnancy prevention programs.<sup>2</sup>
- John McCain voted against legislation that would have prevented unintended pregnancy by investing in insurance coverage for prescription birth control, promoting family-planning services, implementing teen-pregnancy prevention programs, and developing programs to increase awareness about emergency contraception.<sup>3</sup>



# Barack Obama Supports Family Planning

- Barack Obama authored legislation to fix the birth-control pricing crisis facing millions of low-income women and students across the country.<sup>4</sup>
- Barack Obama has voted in favor of funding teen-pregnancy prevention programs.<sup>5</sup>
- Barack Obama was an original co-sponsor of the Prevention First Act, a package of proposals that increases funds for family-planning services, makes sure that health insurance plans cover birth control if they cover other prescription medication, and improves women's ability to get emergency contraception.<sup>6</sup>
